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Review Statement of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International School of Textiles and Management, Coimbatore for the year 2024-25

Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International School of Textiles and Management, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu, was established with a vision to **“emerge as a nationally renowned Centre of Excellence in Textile Management Education, creating a strong cadre of professional managers who will become inspiring performers and decision-makers, capable of attaining high standards and competitive edge to bring the Indian Textile Industry to the forefront”**.

Recognising the emerging changes in the textile industry and the need for the institution to prepare itself for greater roles, it was upgraded to Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel International School of Textiles and Management (SVPISTM) and dedicated to the nation.

Since its inception, about 1727 students have completed their Post-Graduation and Graduation from this institution. Almost all the students have been either placed or have become entrepreneurs. The Institute has been keen on developing the overall personality of the students and making them industry-ready. Several interactions are being arranged with industry captains. Industry visits and personality development programs are some of the efforts in this direction.

Toward this endeavour, the Institute is also organising Management Development Programmes and undertaking consultancy assignments in Textiles & Management.

The Institute has vigorously participated in various Educational and Industrial Fairs in India as part of promotional initiatives.

To achieve the goals stated in the vision Ministry of Textiles had sanctioned grant-in-aid to the tune of Rs. 46.78 Crores for recurring as well as non-recurring expenditure for establishing “SVPISTM” through EFC as a plan Grant during the 10th & 11th five-year plan period. After a period of 10 years, MoT had sanctioned grant-in-aid to the tune of Rs. 50 lakhs each during the financial years 2021-22, 2022-23, 2023-24 to meet the financial exigency caused by the Covid-19 pandemic situation and Rs. 50 lakhs in 2024-2025 for the upgradation of the Laboratories of SVPISTM.

The Institution has collected fees from students to the tune of Rs. 33.10 Crores and generated an internal revenue of Rs. 22.41 Crores through interest and other income up to the financial year 2024-25. Besides, SVPISTM has so far received donations in cash/kind for Rs 1.04 Crores, and the amounts received as donations have been shown as a corpus fund.

6.0 International collaboration:

SVPISTM & GiZ, German Corporation for International Cooperation (GMBH), Germany:

Proposal on the topic “Knowledge, Values, and Education for Sustainable Development in Textiles” to Giz:

SVPISTM, in collaboration with GIZ, successfully implemented the project titled "Knowledge, Values, and Education for Sustainable Development in Textiles", promoting sustainability and skill development across the textile value chain. The project trained 370 beneficiaries, including farmers, ginners, spinners, garment manufacturers, weavers, dyers, rural women, and SVPISTM students. Key training programs included Sustainable Production from Fiber to Finished Garments, benefiting 100 industry stakeholders with advanced knowledge of sustainable production practices; Pattern Making and Garment Construction, empowering 160 rural women with technical and entrepreneurial skills for self-employment; Textile Design Techniques, enhancing the creativity and technical expertise of 60 SVPISTM students; and Non-Woven Fabric Manufacturing, providing hands-on training to 50 students on sustainable fabric applications. The total grant of ₹1.80 crore (approximately) was effectively utilized for program execution, resource procurement, and impactful delivery. The initiative successfully fostered sustainability, empowered rural communities, and prepared students for industry demands.

7.0 Training and industry exposure visit program for the State Administrative Officer Trainees (OTs) from the Bihar Institute of Public Administration and Rural Development (BIPARD)

SVPISTM has been nominated to host 442 State Administrative Officer trainees (OTs) (60-65 in each batch) from Bihar Institute of Public Administration and Rural Development (BIPARD) for a training and industry exposure visit program between 12.05.2024 to 07.07.2024 in and around Coimbatore. The total cost of Rs. 2.29 Crore for eight batches has been reimbursed by BIPARD.

BIPARD's choice of SVPISTM as the venue for this program underscores the institution's robust industry orientation and reputation. SVPISTM has continually fostered a collaborative environment with leading industrial entities, offering its students not only theoretical knowledge but also invaluable practical exposure to real-world scenarios. During their visit, the officers embarked on an enriching itinerary, which included tours of prominent industrial establishments in and around Coimbatore. These visits provided them with firsthand insights into operational processes, technological advancements, and the challenges faced by various industries. Such initiatives aim to bridge the gap between academia and industry, equipping administrative officers with the necessary knowledge to effectively navigate the complexities of the industrial landscape.

8.0 RESEARCH ACTIVITIES:

The research project "Development of Vegetable Leather for Efficient Thermal Insulation Using Coarse Wool & Edible Waste to Target Export Markets" was assigned to SVPISTM by the Central Wool Development Board (CWDB) with a sanctioned amount of ₹26,41,800. As per the sanction order, ₹23,77,620/- (1st and 2nd instalments) has been received, enabling SVPISTM to continue project activities towards its objectives. Experimental studies, including multiple laboratory trials, have confirmed that the appropriate proportions of the wet matrix (crushed edible waste matter mixed with wool waste) are crucial for leather sheet formation. Pilot samples have shown promising results, with further improvements underway in surface finishing. Prototype products such as ladies' sling bags, leather purses, mobile covers, and garments for both kids and adults have been developed. The physical and financial progress report has been submitted as per the prescribed format. Final sample development and corresponding testing are in progress, along with the preparation of the research report. Upon submission of the research report, the balance amount of ₹ 2,64,180 will be received as the final (third) instalment, as per the sanction order.

The Ministry has sanctioned the study/research proposal on 'Development of Herbal finished Women Sanitary Pads and Baby Diapers and a study on its Antimicrobial effect'. The final draft report with revised suggestions and future scope was submitted on 18.10.2024 and the project was completed.

The study tour fostered both academic and cultural enrichment, enhancing students' global perspective on the apparel industry.

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SCHEDULE 14 – SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with historical cost conventions, unless otherwise stated, and on the accrual basis of accounting. It is the primary responsibility of the society to prepare the financial statements true and fair.

2. REVENUE RECOGNITION

In appropriate circumstances, revenue is recognised when no significant uncertainty as to determination or relation exists.

3. CORPUS FUND

The Institute/Society credits the donation received to the corpus fund account.

General-purpose grants received during the year have been accounted for.

Financial Grant of Rs. ₹ 50 lakhs was received on 30.08.2024 for the upgradation of laboratory facilities.

Separate accounts are to be maintained for each Grant received.

4. FIXED ASSETS

- a) Fixed assets are stated at the cost of acquisition, inclusive of inward freight duties, taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to the acquisition.
- b) Fixed asset verification is to be carried out, and the society maintains the register.

5. DEPRECIATION

- a) Depreciation is provided on the WDV method as per the rates specified in the Income-tax Act,1961.
- b) In respect to additions to fixed assets during the year, depreciation is considered on Pro-rata basis.
- c) Assets costing Rs. 5000/- or less each are fully provided.

6. RETIREMENT BENEFITS

- a) The provisions of the Gratuity Act apply to society, and necessary Gratuity provisions for eligible employees have been made as per the Gratuity Act. The Institute hasn't carried out any actuarial valuation for the gratuity liability. The provision is made based on actual liability as on the date of the balance sheet.
- b) Provision for accumulated leave encashment benefit to the employees is accrued and computed on the assumption that employees are entitled to receive the benefit at each year's end. The institute hasn't carried out any actuarial valuation for the leave encashment benefits. The provisions are done based on the present salary and the accrued leave balances as on the end of the financial year.
- c) All known liabilities have been provided for, and long-standing provisions are to be eliminated.
